"What would Jesus do?" – a profound question that cuts to

the heart of the Christian Faith. In Tim Alberta's book, <u>The Kingdom</u>, the Power, and the Glory:

American Evangelicals in an Age of Extremism, he delves in to the complex world of American evangelicals. As a journalist and practicing Christian and the son of an evangelical pastor, Alberta paints a vivid and troubling portrait of this movement.

Through the lens of televangelists, small-town preachers, and everyday churchgoers, Alberta reveals a faith that has been cheapened by fear, a promise tainted by partisan subterfuge, and a reputation marred by scandal. For millions of conservative Christians, America is their kingdom, a land uniquely blessed in a special covenant with God. However, this love of country has sometimes given way to a rightwing nationalist fervor, which trivializes the kingdom of Jesus Christ.

The book sheds light on the perils and potential of the Christian church in America today, exploring the pull toward politicization of the true message of Jesus: to love God completely and to love others sincerely, even those perceived as enemies. In a world where resentment and grievance sometimes overshadow the message of scripture, Alberta's book is a thought-provoking reflection on the intersection of faith, politics, and human nature.

The Little Food Pantry needs You!!!

As a congregation we decided we wanted to have a food pantry to do Gods work and feed the hungry Sounds simple enough but it takes a lot of work and we need help. We have volunteers who fill the pantry everyday, but that is just the beginning. We could use some help for when someone is away or is sick and can't take their day. You could be a substitute.

We have a food sharing Sunday once a month but quite frankly, that doesn't begin to keep the pantry stocked. You don't have to wait for the first Sunday of the month. You can drop off a bag of food anytime to the office.

If you like to shop the sales, you could help. We try to stretch our dollars by watching the ads and getting what we need for the best price. Just turn in your receipts and you will be reimbursed.

<u>If you like to fund raise</u>, you could help. This could most likely be done from home contacting local businesses and asking them to give a donation to the Little Food Pantry or ask them to sell us products we need at a reduced rate.

<u>If you like to organize</u>, you could help. The room where we store the food for the Little Food Pantry always needs help putting donated food on the shelves and checking the expiration dates to be sure things have not expired. This is especially on Food Sharing Sundays.

If you like pets, you could help. We buy food for dogs and cats in big bags. We then break it down into smaller bags to make it go further and cheaper. This has to be done carefully so that we don't attract mice. We need help with buying the big bags.

If you are donating, please keep in mind that most likely these people are not baking. So please limit flour, confectioners sugar and other baking supplies. Also, no more beans please. Beans that have to be soaked for hours probably is not the best choice. We have an abundance of them. Also, food stamps do not allow purchases of toilet paper (which we buy in bulk), shampoo and conditioner, bar soap, toothpaste etc. so these items go very quickly.
