This past school year our middle school youth group has been talking about "People Who are Homeless" This spring we sponsored a clothing drive, served lunches at City Mission of Albany and helped to develop a new program at the City Mission in Schenectady.

The congregation's support was fantastic. We had drivers for both of our outings, filled Mr. L's pickup truck with clothing twice and one of our members came to talk to our group about the homeless situation.

Last Saturday night 7 of the group slept outside in cardboard boxes that they assembled themselves (with guidance of some great parents). It was an experience that the youth will remember for quite a while especially when the sprinkling system rained on us at 4:00 am. We will all remember trying to save our boxes from the water and finally having our boxes collapsing on us. Many lessons were learned from the experience.

At church on Sunday we asked for donations from the congregation while we sat inside our box or in front of the collapsed boxes. Again your support was fantastic. We were able to collect \$504 for our project. The money will be split between City Mission in Albany and the City Mission in Schenectady.

2017 Global Mission EPES Spotlight



Karen Anderson (Chile)

As a Lutheran missionary in Chile from 1982–2000, Karen Anderson founded and directed EPES, Educación Popular en Salud. EPES works to build a sustainable health care organization dedicated to promoting the health, dignity and rights of poor people in Chile and throughout the region through education, empowerment and collective action.

In 2009, she returned as an ELCA missionary to help the EPES staff design, launch and direct EPES' International Training Course on Popular Education in Health which,

among other important tasks, explores the role of the church in the struggle for health and human rights. In the past eight years, the International Training program has had 150 participants from 19 countries, including participants from eleven Lutheran churches from other Latin American countries.

In the past three years, EPES' work has expanded to Africa as women from Kenya, Uganda and Zimbabwe participated in the International Training Course. Upon returning home, they have been implementing EPES training model in their local communities.
