When [the shepherds] saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them. ~

Luke 2:17-20



Joyful. As lights start appearing everywhere and familiar seasonal music fills our lives, as we gather for parties and fellowship and think about how to gift those we care about, we often experience the joy of the Christmas season. It is a joy that fills us with laughter and hope and a sense of community and draws us closer to those around us. It is the joy of a baby born to humble parents, and the savior of the world living among us. It is the joy of a family created, and families gathered. It is the joy of giving and loving and celebrating. It is the joy of our lives touched by God in our midst.

Joyless? But sometimes, that joy does not find us as we expect. Sometimes, Christmas reminds us of what we do not have, of broken relationships and battered dreams. We have said good bye to too many people. We look at the life we have and see regrets and losses and sorrows. We are overwhelmed by the demands and the cost and the happiness of others seems to mock us.

Joy! As I think about Mary and Joseph and that long trip to Bethlehem while pregnant, and all the trouble they must have faced as unwed parents, and the disappointment of sleeping in a stable, I wonder how much joy there was for them that night, at least at first. The uncertainty and the unexpected clashing to create a less than ideal birth, and a baby in a small, forgotten stable probably didn't seem like a very joyful experience.

Joy!! But, then the angels started to sing, and a rag-tag group of shepherd heard the joyful song. They caught that joy and rushed off to see the baby Jesus. And now, Mary has caught some of that joy and wonder. She ponders all that has happened, and she treasures it. Finally, the shepherds share their joy with everyone, shouting about Jesus' birth all over town.

Joy!!! That first Christmas probably didn't start with too much joy, but God broke into that dreary night in the form of a helpless infant, and that did bring joy! Joy for angels and shepherds and Mary and Joseph and the town of Bethlehem and joy for us. So when we find ourselves struggling to see the joy of Christmas, when we can't quite seem to get into the spirit, we look to that most important of moments, the moment of "God with us," God in our midst, God in the form of a baby, and we grasp that joy, if only for the smallest of instances, as we realize all that Jesus' birth means for us.

The passage above is from the Song of Zechariah, also known as the Benedictus. When I came to be in your midst in March 2009 it was a time of new beginnings. Starting a new call with you was not something I had anticipated until I received a message that Bishop Marie Jerge wanted me to consider a ministry at Prince of Peace. After lots of prayer and discernment over a period of 9 months my wife Linda and I found ourselves worshiping and serving with you.

We have had our share of joys and struggles, triumphs and setbacks, but through it all we have grown close and together we have learned how to better live into our Purpose Statement.

You have made me a better pastor and for that I am profoundly thankful. The ministry I experienced with you is something for which I will be forever grateful.

As we all know change comes to life and it comes to ministry as well. I am at a stage of life in which I need to make some changes. This is also a time in which I have been sensing and testing a new sense of call – to part time intentional interim ministry.

I hesitate to term my next step in life retirement, as I do intend to serve as a pastor with congregations that are without a regular pastor and are preparing for the next step to which God is leading them. I also will continue to serve as a pastoral coach and may occasionally provide pastoral services to those who aren't connected with a church.

Linda and I do not plan on leaving the area but once my call is complete here, I will no longer be your pastor. I commend to you the Covenant of Closure which is being finalized by the Council and myself. This covenant will give guidelines on our relationship going forward.

My last Sunday at Prince of Peace will be January 26, 2020.

I will hold Prince of Peace in my prayers and Linda and I ask that you pray for us.

#### Thrivent Action at Prince of Peace in 2019

Thrivent provides Action Grants in the amount of \$250 that can be used to support good works at both Prince of Peace and within our community. Thrivent Members at Prince of Peace obtained Action Grants to complete the following projects in 2019:

- Pack the Little Food Pantry. Three different Thrivent Members each obtained grants of \$250 to help keep the Little Food Pantry's shelves stocked. A total of \$750 was used to purchase food supplies and motivate further donations.
- Mother's Day Brunch. An Action Grant was used to purchase food supplies for the annual Mother's Day Brunch. This \$250 grant served as seed money to allow the Mother's Day Brunch to maximize its donation to EPES.
- Construction Supplies for Eagle Scout Project. A \$250 grant was used to purchase necessary construction supplies for the completion of a sandbox with retractable cover for the Nursery School at Prince of Peace. This grant was combined with a separate grant from the Grace Endowment Fund. This project was completed by Robbie Bodien.
- Lunch Supplies for Eagle Scout Project. Another Action Grant was used to provide the lunch needed to feed all of the volunteers that worked on Robbie Bodien's Eagle Scout Project throughout the day!
- Inspirational Books for Prison Ministry. A \$250 grant was used to purchase 35 copies of inspirational books by Greg Boyle to be used in a Prison Ministry. This grant was used to supplement a Fall 2019 grant from the Grace Endowment Fund that did not fully meet the anticipated needs of the project.
- Brendan's Breakfast. Two separate Action Grants were used to purchase food supplies for Brendan's Breakfasts in 2019. This \$500 served as seed money to allow the Brendan's Breakfasts to achieve their mission and maximize their support for Senior High Camp.
- Cheryl's Lodge Bountiful Backpack Program. A \$250 grant was used to support Cheryl's Lodge's Bountiful Backpack Program that provides food security for community youth in need. Cheryl's Lodge is associated with CAPTAIN.
- Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper. An Action Grant was used to purchase food supplies for the annual Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper put on by the Prince of Peace Junior and Senior High Youth. This \$250 grant again served as vital seed money to allow the Youth to maximize their donation to a local community service organization.

## PRINCE OF PEACE FOOD PANTRY The 1st Sunday of each month is Food Pantry Sunday.



We now have some people who will be helping this ministry which involves checking the food for expiration dates, organizing the food on shelves, and checking to see what items we can use in the pantry and notifying the congregation to the needs.

The FBI has work hard to stencil cloth bags for the congregation to use to bring the food to church. Our goal to decrease the use of plastic bags. At the entrance of church, you will find a clothes pole with empty bags. Please take one bag home with you. Fill it with food to bring to church on Food Sunday. Place your full bag on the cart at the entrance and take a bag home for the next month. Every time you bring food to church take an empty bag home to fill for the next month. If we use the cloth bags we help our world in two ways...one by feeding the hungry and one by helping our environment.

- ⇒ Soups/Stew

- ⇒ Cans of Crushed tomatoes.
- ⇒ Vegetable soup.

- ⇒ Pinto beans.
- ⇒ Tomato soup




